



Robert Winkler Public Service Award (\$500.00) Nauck Civic Association Education Assistance Application

Purpose:

The Nauck Civic Association Education Assistance Fund's purpose and goal is to recognize and award high school graduates of Arlington Public Schools or an Alternative Program with a monetary gift to assist with school expenses or other needs for a successful transition into college or an accredited post-secondary program. The Nauck Civic Association Executive Board selects one student who has applied to receive \$500 educational fund money in memory of the service of community leader, Robert Winkler. Previous recipients may also submit an application for this fund if they are continuing their education at a college, university or post-secondary program, all requirements are met, and money is available.

Eligibility Requirements:

1. Be a resident of the Nauck Community and a graduate of Arlington County Public High School and has been accepted or is a full-time student (12 semester credit hours or more) in an accredited two- or four-year college, university, technical or higher education institution recognized by the U.S. Department of Education.
2. Possess at least a 2.5 cumulative GPA on a 4.0 scale
3. Demonstrated interest in math and has been active in the Nauck Community with tutoring/mentor programs, church, summer programs, etc.
4. Provide one letter of recommendation from a teacher, counselor or community leader.
5. Draft a 250-word essay on "**How Can I Serve My Community**". Plus completion of questions on attached application.

Application Process:

All applications received will be reviewed by the *Nauck Civic Association Executive Board Committee*. The deadline for submitting your application must be post marked or emailed no later than **June 30th**. The scholarship winner will be notified prior to and announced at the Nauck Civic and Community Pride Day, which is held the third Saturday in September at Dr. Charles R. Drew Elementary School. The scholarship award of \$500.00 will be presented to the scholarship recipient (proof of enrollment required prior to award).
